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Introduction and Methodology

- ◆ Gregg, Kelly, Sullivan & Woolstencroft: *The Strategic Counsel* is pleased to present findings of The Globe and Mail/CTV November Polling Program.
- ◆ The findings are based on interviews conducted by telephone among a weighted national sample of 1000 adult Canadians 18 years of age or older.
- ◆ The interviews were conducted between November 5th and November 6th, 2005.
- ◆ A sample of 1,000 yields a margin of error of +/- 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
- ◆ Note: Due to rounding, proportions may not total 100%.

Key Conclusions

- ◆ Over the weekend, actual momentum has shifted away from the Conservatives back toward the Liberals. The Liberals have regained a solid lead in Ontario and have improved their scores in Ontario and Western Canada.

- ◆ However, perhaps as a result of media coverage of polls over the weekend showing a large drop in Liberal support and a commensurate increase in Conservative fortunes, neither party is now seen by the public to be commanding momentum toward an election victory.

- ◆ Why the increase in Liberal support? Two possible reasons:
 - The blanket coverage of Gomery had faded by the weekend to the point that it was off most newscasts and front pages.
 - The sudden possibility of a Conservative victory once more gave a significant number of voters - especially in Ontario - pause, and an occasion to reassess their support.

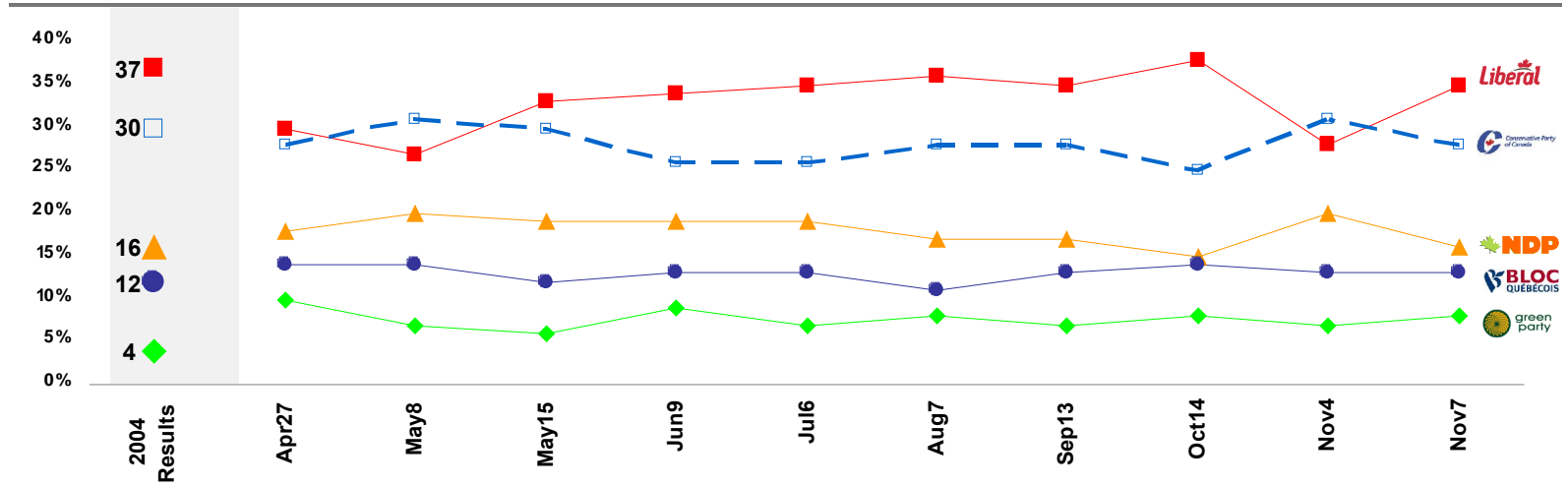
